Christ Candle

Today we introduce the Christ Candle to worship. The addition of the Christ candle is a visible sign that we intentionally invite the light of Jesus Christ to be present with us here in worship as well as in our lives.

We have many scriptural references to Christ as the light.

Luke 2:30-32

"for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel"

John 8:12

"Jesus spoke to the people again, saying, 'I am the **light** of the world. Whoever follows me won't walk in darkness but will have the **light** of life."

John 1:4-5

"In him was life and the life was the **light** of all people. ⁵ The **light** shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

Isaiah 9:2

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great **light**. On those living in a pitch-dark land, **light** has dawned."

Isaiah 60:1

"Arise! Shine! Your light has come; the LORD's glory has shone upon you."

Isaiah 60:19

"The sun will no longer be your light by day, nor will the moon shine for illumination by night. The LORD will be your **everlasting light**; your God will be your glory."

Each time we gather for worship we will light the Christ Candle reminding ourselves that we are people of the light. We invite Christ to be present here for our worship and as we leave this worship space, we carry the light of Christ in our hearts out into the world.
