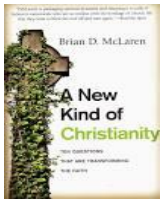

Stronghold Retreat Center in Oregon, IL.

Our speaker is Rev. Jon Phillips. Nine years ago, Jon left his job at an architectural firm in Washington State and moved to Chicago to attend McCormick Theological Seminary. He currently serves two congregations - as Pastor of Evergreen Park Presbyterian Church, and Associate Pastor at Lake View Presbyterian Church. In his free time, Jon is working very slowly on a PhD at Chicago Theological Seminary, teaches occasionally at Saint Xavier University, parents his nine-month-old daughter Audrey with his spouse Caroline (also a Teaching Elder in Chicago Presbytery), and officiates roller derby. Jon will be leading discussions on the question of "What does it mean to be a Christian man in the world of masculinity, racism, and #metoo?"
