REFLECTION FOR WORSHIP

All Saints' Day, celebrated on November 1, honors the great communion of saints—those known and unknown—who live in the nearer presence of Christ. Its roots reach back to the early church, when Christians gathered to remember martyrs and faithful witnesses who had suffered and died for the faith. By the third century, writers such as Gregory Thaumaturgus and Ephrem the Deacon spoke of commemorations of all martyrs, and in the fourth century John Chrysostom noted the observance of a feast of all saints in Constantinople. The November 1 observance is thought to have originated in Ireland, spreading to England, the continent, and eventually Rome by the ninth century.
