We are excited to welcome jazz pianist Jeremy Kahn, one of Chicago's busiest pianists, dividing his time between jazz venues, pit orchestras, and recording and teaching studios. He has performed on stage with Dizzy Gillespie, Joni Mitchell, Aretha Franklin, Branford Marsalis, the Chicago and Milwaukee Symphony Orchestras, and on screen with Madonna and Mary Wilson. Jeremy has played at many of Chicago's leading downtown and suburban theaters for shows such as Wicked, Spamalot, The Lion King, Les Miserables, Aida, and Aladdin.

Appearing with Jeremy will be Eric Schneider (sax and clarinet), Clark Sommers (bass), George Fludas (drums), and Paul Marinaro (vocals). They will sing and swing the great Standards, featuring composers like George Gershwin and Duke Ellington. Admission is free.

explore some of King's sermons and see how they relate to us today. This class will be led by Kelly Bufton.



The Hidden Roots of White Supremacy and the Future of American Democracy A Program of Fourth Presbyterian Church

Wednesday, January 31 6:30 p.m. Chapel

We'll gather in the chapel to livestream this adult ed program from Fourth Pres.

Come to hear **Robert P. Jones**, author of the New York Times bestselling book The Hidden Roots of White Supremacy and

the Path to a Shared American Future.

In a presentation moderated by Fourth Church member Cynthia Johnson, Mr. Jones will explain how the founders of the United States could build the philosophical framework for a democratic society on a foundation of mass racial violence — and why this paradox survives today in the form of white Christian nationalism.

Through stories of people navigating these contradictions in three communities, Jones illuminates the possibility of a new American future in which we finally fulfill the promise of a pluralistic democracy.



Robert P. Jones is the president and founder of Public Religion Research Institute (PRRI) and writes regularly on politics, culture, and religion for the Atlantic, TIME, Religion News Service, and other outlets.

He is frequently featured in major national media, such as CNN, MSNBC, NPR, the New York Times, the Washington Post, and others. He is also the author of White Too Long: The Legacy of White Supremacy in American Christianity, which won a 2021 American Book Award, and The End of White Christian America, which won the 2019 Grawemeyer Award in Religion.

Jones writes weekly at <u>robertpjones.substack.com</u>, a newsletter for those dedicated to the work of truth-telling, repair, and healing from the legacy of white supremacy in American Christianity. He holds a Ph.D. in religion from Emory University and an M.Div. from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

COVID UPDATE

Information posted by CDC indicates the emergence of a new COVID variant and a rise in hospitalizations. DuPage County is currently designated at the Medium level for COVID. At this level, the CDC recommends those at high risk of getting very sick (e.g., immunocompromised, underlying health conditions) wear a mask when indoors in public, in addition to the general

guidance for all stay up to date with vaccinations, ventilate indoor spaces, wash hands frequently, and avoid contact with those who are infected.

At this time, there are no new recommended actions at CPC. We will continue to do things such as Passing the Peace and Communion in ways that minimize the opportunity for virus spread. We will continue to monitor the situation and advise of any needed adjustments.
