





ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES for the year will start on September 17, at 10:45.



Our first two classes will delve into our hymnal, *Glory to God*. We'll explore the process that the compilers used to select the hymns. Then we'll do a deeper dive into the global selections, focusing on African Song and on Asian Song, the songs of the Pacific Rim. Our instructor is Dr. Lorraine Brugh, Senior Research Professor at Valparaiso University. She is a past president and charter member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. From 2021-2022, Dr. Brugh served as Artist in Residence at Pinnacle Presbyterian Church in Scottsdale, Arizona. She is a member of the North Academy of Liturgy, the American Guild of Organists, and she currently resides in Peoria, Arizona.



Time to Register for a Discussion Group: Social Justice Summer Read




