

ADULT ED – ABOLITION AND THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD 10:45-11:45 am
Hybrid; Chapel or Zoom

We are fortunate to be able to host a presentation today by the director of the Knox College Underground Railroad Freedom Center in Galesburg. Owen Muelder is nationally recognized as an expert on abolition and the Underground Railroad. He has written two acclaimed books on the subject: The Underground Railroad in Western Illinois and Theodore Dwight Weld and the American Anti-slavery Society.

He will begin his presentation with brief remarks about the era in which the abolitionist movement became well organized. The second phase of his talk will discuss the Underground Railroad nationally, and then move to a discussion of the UGRR in the state of Illinois, where Galesburg was a key center of activism. He will end his remarks with a brief discussion of the movement in the Chicago area. Bring your curiosity and learn with us.




