








Unleash your inner artist as Robin Randall leads us in an Art Therapy Workshop.



COVID UPDATE

As you have probably heard in the news, the number of people being infected with respiratory viruses (i.e., influenza, COVID, and RSV) is steadily increasing. The statistic being tracked by the CDC is "COVID-19 new hospital admissions", as a number per 100,000 population by county, updated weekly. Last week, the number for DuPage County was 10.4, which crossed the boundary of 10 separating Low from Medium; the number for the prior week was 9.1. When the new hospitalizations rate is Medium, the CDC recommends those at high risk of getting very sick (e.g., immunocompromised, underlying health conditions) wear a mask when indoors in public, in addition to the general guidance for all stay up to date with vaccinations, ventilate indoor spaces, wash hands frequently, and avoid contact with those who are infected.

No new recommended actions at CPC. We will continue to do things such as Passing the Peace and Communion in ways that minimize the opportunity for virus spread.
