A typical morning will include: Gathering and Music, Bible Story, Crafts & Activities, Movement & Games & Compassion in Action



MEMORIAL GARDEN ENHANCEMENTS

Start this week

CPC's cherished Memorial Garden is getting a refresh this summer! Following recent Session approval, three projects funded by earnings from the Endowment Fund will come together to enhance the safety and beauty of CPC's Memorial Garden. The projects include:

- Replacing a 60-foot-long section of concrete sidewalk running north and south between the parking lot and the church entrance
- Releveling, resetting, and replacing broken pavers in the Memorial Garden
- Replacing invasive shrub species with native shrubs to enhance the garden's attractiveness for both our community and for pollinators, such as birds, bees, and butterflies.

All work will be carried out with care and respect for our sacred space of memory. In doing this work, CPC aims to make the hard surfaces of the Memorial

Garden safe and solid for the next 30 years, and to use our beautiful property to support God's wondrous creation.

If you would like to see current examples of God's wondrous creation thriving in CPC's garden spaces, take a stroll to the garden at the corner of Prospect and Norfolk, or to the butterfly garden on the southwest corner of the property, where you will find bees and butterflies busy doing their work. And, at the moment, you might find very hungry monarch caterpillars enjoying the milkweed plants at the entrance to the parking lot.

Worship with us on Sunday June 25 to be inspired by the preaching and worship leadership of Rev Larry Morris. He will be sharing updates about the campus ministry with GLTBQ+ students at University of Illinois at Chicago.

Larry is a self-described personality junkie, Apple loyalist, and plant parent. Larry is from Indianapolis, IN, but has spent the last ten years on the west coast in California and Nevada. He is the co-founder of Communion Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Henderson, NV, and owner of Larry J. Morris III, LLC which helps people and organizations "realize their extraordinary purpose "." Larry is a Ph.D. student in the African American Preaching and Sacred Rhetoric program at Christian Theological Seminary (Indianapolis, IN). Their research interests focus on the intersections of Blackness, queerness, and sacred rhetoric. Larry comes to the Inclusive Collective with a variety of unique experiences, including community organizing, diversity, equity, and inclusion consulting, and program development and management.
