
# SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION! Exploring the Hymnal TODAY 10:45, Chapel & Zoom

Our first two classes will delve into our hymnal, *Glory to God*. We'll explore the process that the compilers used to select the hymns. Then we'll do a deeper dive into the global selections, focusing on African Song and on Asian Song, the songs of the Pacific Rim. Our instructor is Dr. Lorraine Brugh, Senior Research Professor at Valparaiso University. She is a past president and charter member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. From 2021-2022, Dr. Brugh served as Artist in Residence at Pinnacle Presbyterian Church in Scottsdale, Arizona. She is a

member of the North Academy of Liturgy, the American Guild of Organists, and she currently resides in Peoria, Arizona.

Although she was not part of the *Glory to God* development team, Dr. Brugh has become very knowledgeable on the hymnal, with a particular interest in the Pacific Rim selections.

As always, the classes will be presented in a hybrid format – onsite in the chapel and offsite via Zoom. Dr. Brugh will join us remotely from Arizona.



# CIRCLE OF VOICES September 20 Gathering Room 9:30 am



"OUR FUTURE IS NOW" INFORMATION SESSION Wednesday, September 20 7:00 pm Chapel

As we reported in our recent Session Blast, our Elders had a thoughtful discussion about CPC's two-pastor staffing model in June. At CPC, we greatly value the caring spiritual leadership and ability to prioritize youth in our two-pastor model. Although our church's financial position is strong, we can no longer maintain two-pastor staffing without a significant revenue increase.

At the June meeting, Session unanimously voted to: 1) set a 2024 Stewardship goal of \$572,000 (+\$75,000 or +15% vs. this year), and 2) assuming success, maintain our two-pastor staff model. Going forward, our Associate Pastor would lead the Youth Ministries that have always been such an important priority at CPC.


